Census Information for Levens Township (Civil Parish from 1891 census onwards) is not just Beathwaite Green/Cotes/Cinderbarrow because it includes parts of Brigsteer & Leasgill as well as Sampool, Lord's Plain, College Green, Ninezergh, Mabbin Hall, Sizergh Cottages, Sizergh Fell, Force Cottages, Heaves, Hyning, Bridge End & Whitbarrow Lodge. Note subsequent area changes.

NOTE 1. – Note that the censuses record persons present on the night of the census. This obviously excludes residents who were away, but includes visitors. For 1981 & 1991 the published info differentiates between total "persons present" and "residents" & I have used the latter information.						
NOTE 2. – Due to snapshot character of census information undue emphasis should not be given to the precise population totals.						
COMMENTS						
1 – Note the population decline between the 1881 & 1901 censuses. This is significant and not just due to the interpretation of the census documents or "snapshot" character of the data. Presume there was a genuine decline due to migration within the UK and emigration to other countries.						
2 – Note that in the 1901 census there were a total of 11 buildings shown as unoccupied in Bridge Row (inc Toll Bar cottage). This was the entire row of houses. Where had all the people gone? In 1891, 32 people were recorded in 7 houses (plus 4 empty) in Bridge Row, and in 1881 there were 34 people in 8 houses (plus 3 empty ones) and no mention of a pub. In 1871 there were no empties and 10 houses held 33 people, & there had been a pub (Bridge Inn). The 1861 census listed 69 people in 11 houses. In 1851 there were 59 in 11 houses plus one empty and in 1841 a total of 74 people were recorded in 13 houses (plus one uninhabited). Whatever the vagaries of census data interpretation might apply to these figures it is obvious that quite a community existed at Bridge Row, to say nothing of the adjacent Toll bar, pub, smithy & the dwellings known as Bridge End & Birks, but which was empty in 1901. Unfortunately, Subsequent census years are not accessible. Note that Bridge Row is (in 2008) known to have been inhabited within living memory and that the last time the Levens School admissions register records the admission of a child living at Bridge Row was April 1947 (Isabel Looker).

An attempt has been made to identify the census entries relating to the area of the modern village, i.e. the area bounded by the Levens Catchwater in the West, Lane End Farm in the North, the A590 in the South and Heaves Farm & Lawrence House in the East. This area contains Winthwaite, Hyning, Cotes, Cinderbarrow, Causeway End as well as what was regarded as Beathwaite Green.							
NOTE 1. – Note that the censuses record persons present on the night of the census. This obviously excludes residents who were away, but includes visitors. For 1981 & 1991 the published info differentiates between total "persons present" and "residents" & I have used the latter information.							
NOTE 2. – Due to snapshot character of census information undue emphasis should not be given to the precise population totals.							
NOTE 3. - Fairly rapidly done summary. If somebody else repeats the exercise don't be surprised if the figures differ a bit.							
COMMENTS							
1 – Fluctuating totals follow those of the complete Parish (see sheet entitled "simplified census info") with 1841 having the highest headcount & 1871 the most inhabited houses.							
2 – Comparison with complete Parish highlights fact that what we now tend to regard as the Village of Levens is/was by no means an overwhelmingly large proportion of the whole.							
3 – Note the population decline between the 1881 & 1901 censuses. This is significant and not due to the interpretation of the census documents or "snapshot" character of the data. I presume there was a genuine decline due to migration within the UK and emigration to other countries.
